Equipment qualifier  
Code identifying type of equipment.

<b>AA</b>	Ground equipment Ground equipment being fuelled or serviced.
<b>AB</b>	Chain Chain used in the securing of cargo.
<b>AD</b>	Temperature recorder Temperature recorder to provide a record of the actual temperature.
<b>AE</b>	Body trailer The part of the vehicle where the cargo is loaded.
<b>BL</b>	Blocks A piece of equipment that is normally a piece of wood to fix cargo (e.g. coils) during transport.
<b>BPN</b>	Box pallet non exchangeable Self explanatory.
<b>BPY</b>	Box pallet EUR Y non exchangeable Self explanatory.
<b>BR</b>	Barge Flat bottomed inland cargo vessel for canals and rivers with or without own propulsion for the purpose of transported goods. (Synonym: Lighter).
<b>BX</b>	Boxcar Description to be provided.
<b>CH</b>	Chassis A wheeled carriage onto which an ocean container is mounted for inland conveyance.
<b>CN</b>	Container Equipment item as defined by ISO for transport. It must be of: A) permanent character, strong enough for repeated use; B) designed to facilitate the carriage of goods, by one or more modes of transport, without intermediate reloading; C) fitted with devices for its ready handling, particularly.
<b>DPA</b>	Deadlight (panel) Self explanatory.
<b>EFP</b>	Exchangeable EUR flat pallet Self explanatory.
<b>EYP</b>	Exchangeable EUR Y box pallet Self explanatory.
<b>FPN</b>	Flat pallet EUR non exchangeable Self explanatory.
<b>FPR</b>	Flat pallet (railway property) non exchangeable Self explanatory.
<b>FSU</b>	Forked support Self explanatory.
<b>LAR</b>	Lashing rope Self explanatory.
<b>LU</b>	Load/unload device on equipment A mechanical device used in the loading and/or unloading of cargo into and from transport equipment.
<b>MPA</b>	Movable panel Self explanatory.
<b>PA</b>	Pallet A platform on which goods can be stacked in order to facilitate the movement by a forklift or sling.

<b>PBP</b>	Identified private box pallet Self explanatory.
<b>PPF</b>	Identified private flat pallet Self explanatory.
<b>PL</b>	Platform A piece of equipment normally having a flat surface, or prepared for carrying cargo with a specific shape.
<b>PPA</b>	Protecting panel Self explanatory.
<b>PST</b>	Portable stove Self explanatory.
<b>RF</b>	Flat car Description to be provided.
<b>RG</b>	Reefer generator A generator used to control the temperature in temperature-controlled transport equipment.
<b>RGF</b>	Ground facility Storage tank or facility capable of receiving shipment of goods or commodity.
<b>RO</b>	Rope Rope used in the securing of cargo.
<b>RR</b>	Rail car [8320] Registered identification number of railway wagon (CIM 19).
<b>SCA</b>	Small container category A Self explanatory.
<b>SCB</b>	Small container category B Self explanatory.
<b>SCC</b>	Small container category C Self explanatory.
<b>SFA</b>	Stiffening ring of frame Self explanatory.
<b>SPP</b>	Identified special pallet Self explanatory.
<b>STR</b>	Strap Self explanatory.
<b>SW</b>	Swap body Rectangular equipment unit without wheels, which can be mounted on a chassis or positioned on legs.
<b>TE</b>	Trailer A vehicle without motive power, designed for the carriage of cargo and to be towed by a motor vehicle.
<b>TP</b>	Tarpaulin Waterproof material, e.g. canvas, to spread over cargo to protect it from getting wet.
<b>TS</b>	Tackles [8030] Identification marks and numbers of loading tackle used (sheets, ropes, chains, etc.), as specified in DCU 9 to CIM Article 13; and of containers, as specified in Articles 5 and 10 of Annex III to CIM (CIM 17).
<b>TSU</b>	Tarpaulin support Self explanatory.
<b>UL</b>	ULD (Unit load device) An aircraft container or pallet.
